

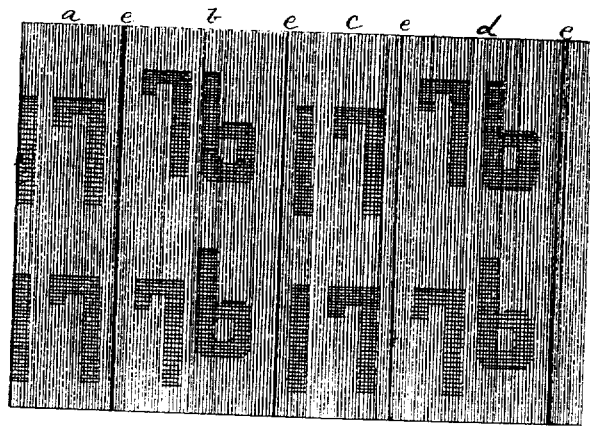

DESIGN FOR FABRICS FOR CLOTHING.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,551**, dated July 27, 1875; application filed July 19, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

CASE B.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWARD C. CLARK, of Rockville, Tolland county, Connecticut, have invented a Design for Fabrics for Clothing, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying illustration, to which reference is made.

The body or ground of the fabric is composed of stripes *a b c d*, separated by ribs or threads, contrasting in color with the body of the stripes; or the ground of the stripes between the ribs *e* may be of colors contrasting each with its adjacent stripe; or the wide stripes *b b* may have the ground part, on which the figures "6" are woven, of a color contrasting with the color of the ground on which the figures "7" are woven, the object of these ribs or contrasting colors being to divide the ground into longitudinal stripes, and on this longitud-

inally-striped ground is woven the figures "76," in any desired form of figure and color or weave, and between the figures "76—76" are woven the figures "17."

I claim—

1. The design for fabric for clothing, consisting of the longitudinally-striped ground and figures "76."
2. The longitudinal stripe and figures "17" arranged thereon.
3. The longitudinally-striped ground with figures "17" and "76" arranged in rows, as shown.
