

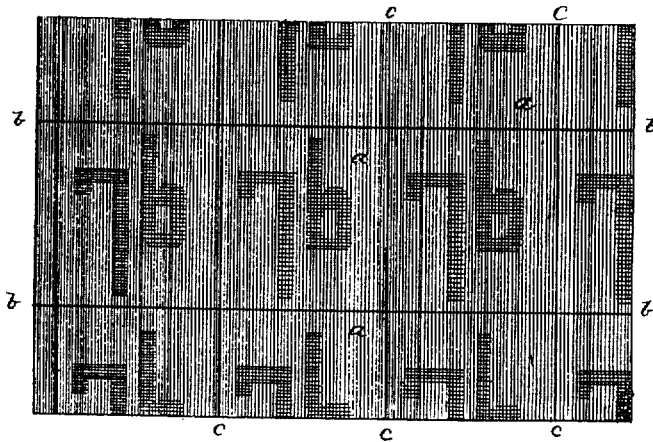

DESIGN FOR FABRICS FOR CLOTHING.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,552**, dated July 27, 1875; application filed July 19, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

CASE C.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWARD C. CLARK, of Rockville, Tolland county, Connecticut, have invented a Design for Fabrics for Clothing, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying illustration, to which reference is made.

The ground of the fabric is laid out in squares *a*, by the crossing and longitudinal ribs or threads *b c*, of weave or colors contrasting with the ground, and in these squares are woven in contrasting weave or color the figures "76." The squares *a* may be each made of colors contrasting with the squares

touching its sides, and then the ribs or threads *b c* may be omitted.

I claim—

The design for fabrics for clothing, consisting of a ground laid out in squares, and with the figures "76" within the squares, as set forth.
