

DESIGN FOR FABRICS FOR CLOTHING.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8.553, dated July 27, 1875; application filed July 19, 1875. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

CASE D.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWARD C. CLARK, of Rockville, Tolland county, Connecticut, have invented a Design for Fabrics for Clothing, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying illustration, to which reference is made.

The body or ground a of the fabric is divided into longitudinal stripes by the ribs or threads b, and is provided with a side band, c, of the same or of a color contrasting with the body of the fabric, and on this side band is woven in a line in the direction of the length of the fabric the figures "76." The ground of this side band may be of a color or weave contrasting with the body of the fabric, which may be plain, striped, or checked. The fig-

ures "76" may be of any size, shape, color, or weave.

I claim—

The design for fabrics for clothing, consisting of the ground provided with the side band, and the side band provided with the figures "76," arranged in a longitudinal column on said side band, as shown and described.
