DESIGN FOR CLOCK-CASES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,557, dated August 3, 1875; application filed July 24, 1875.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM F. MULLER, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for Clock-Cases, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

A represents the base of the case, the end arts of which project downward, to serve as set, and have an ornamental carving formed upon them. In the middle part of the base A is formed an ornamental carving with a bright ornament in its center. B is the body of the case, which is made narrower than the length of the base A. Upon the projecting ends of the base A are short ornamental columns C, from the inner side of the heads of which arms D extend up to the projections E, ormed upon the sides of the body B. The

sides of the lower part of the body B are widened opposite the columns C. The top F of the case is made wider than the body B, and has ornamental projections G formed upon its ends, which extend downward along the upper part of the case. Upon the ends of the top F are formed upward projections H, and upon the middle part of said top is formed an ornamental projection, I. The door-frame J is made arched in its upper part and rectangular in its lower part. The front of the case is ornamented with carved leaves, flowers, vines, and ornamental lines, as shown in the photograph.

I claim as my invention-

The design for a clock-case, herein shown and described.
