DESIGN FOR PRINTING-TYPE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,559, dated August 3, 1875; application filed July 19, 1875. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To_all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John K. Rogers, of Brookline, in the county of Norfolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented a Design for Printing-Types, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying impression from the types, to which reference is made.

The face is very wide, consists of capitals,

subalterns, figures, and points, and combines, to some extent in the capitals, the roman with the black letter character.

What I claim is—

The design for a font of printing-types, as shown and described.
