DESIGN FOR BIRD-CAGE AND HANGING-BASKET HOOKS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8.562, dated August 10, 1875; application filed June 26, 1875. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Francis T. Fracker, of New Britain, in the county of Hartford and State of Connecticut, have invented or produced a Design for a Bird-Cage or Hanging-Basket Hook, of which the following is a specification:

The accompanying drawing represents the said design.

The stem of the hook F is made straight from the circular base A to the point B, thence to the point C in the form of an arc of a circle to the hook D. The sides of the hook D are recessed, and ornamented with squares in relief, as at c. The stem F is made in perforated

scroll-work, as represented, giving it a light and ornamental appearance. A bead, as shown at g, is on the upper and lower edges of the stem.

I claim as my invention-

The design of the bird-cage or hanging-basket hook, made with a straight and curved stem, with a bead on the upper and lower edges, and ornamented substantially as shown and described.
