

DESIGN FOR FIRE-PLACE HEATER.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,567, dated August 17, 1875; application filed August 6, 1875.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Philip Rollhaus, Jr., of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Designs for Fire-Place Heater; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, which form a part of this specification.

My design relates to fire-place heaters, and is fully represented in the accompanying illustration, to which reference is made.

The outside frame of the heater has a center-piece at the top, with scroll-work extending down on both sides, and embracing an upright figure on each side of the heater, the scroll-work extending below the figures and inward for a suitable distance at the bottom, the center of the bottom being taken up by the name of the stove or heater. The body

of the heater is formed of a top piece, as shown, below which is a series of rows of scroll-work. Below these are openings formed by a series of columns united by arches at the top. Below these openings, then, come one or more rows of scroll-work, and then the doors, as shown. Below the doors are one or more rows of scroll-work, and then the ashpan. The columns, with their arches and the doors, are made of the designs of leaves and flowers, as shown, and on each side of the same within the outside frame is other scroll-work.

What I claim is—

The design for fire-place heater, as shown and described.
