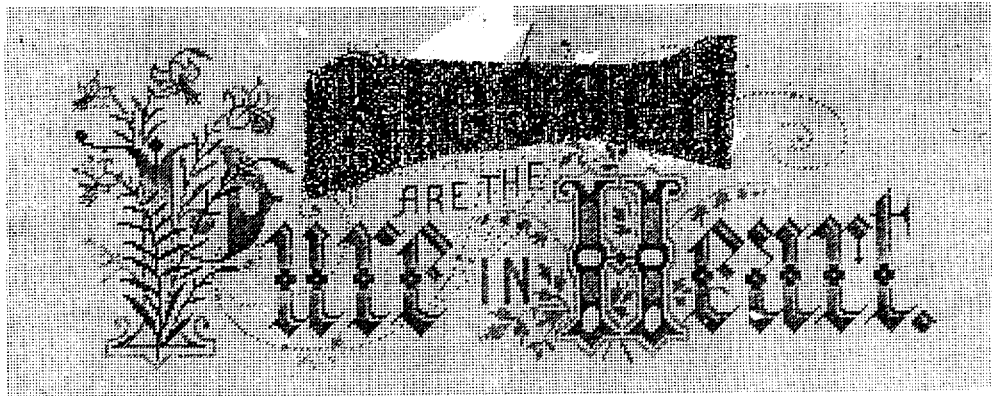

## DESIGN FOR EMBROIDERY-PATTERNS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,572, dated August 24, 1875; application filed July 19, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

### CASE GG.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, EMIL CRISAND, of New Haven, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Embroidery-Pattern; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a face view.

This invention relates to a design for embroidery-pattern, specially adapted to perforated board, the object being to indicate on the board the design to be wrought; and it consists in the peculiar configuration of the letters, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

The motto which constitutes the principal feature of this design is "Blessed are the Pure in Heart." The chief characteristics of the design are the capitals. Interwoven with the words is a floriated tracery, emblematical of purity, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

I claim—

The design for embroidery-pattern herein described, consisting of the motto "Blessed are the Pure in Heart," in form as shown in the accompanying illustration.
