DESIGN FOR EMBROIDERY-PATTERNS.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EMIL CRISAND, of New Haven, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Embroidery-Pattern; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a face view.

This invention relates to a design for embroidery-pattern, specially designed for perforated board, the object being to indicate upon the surface the pattern to be wrought; and it consists in the peculiar configuration of the letters, combined with an emblem, as shown in the accompanying illustration and more fully hereinafter described.

The motto which forms the base of this de-

sign is "Rock of Ages." The form of the let ters, which constitutes the peculiar characteristic of the design, is clearly shown in the accompanying illustration. Combined with these words is an emblem, consisting of the representation of a rock and a cross standing thereon.

The particular arrangement of the emblem relative to the words is not material to the design, it only being essential that the emblem should be present.

I claim-

The design for embroidery-pattern herein described, consisting of the motto "Rock of Ages," in form as shown in the accompanying illustration.
