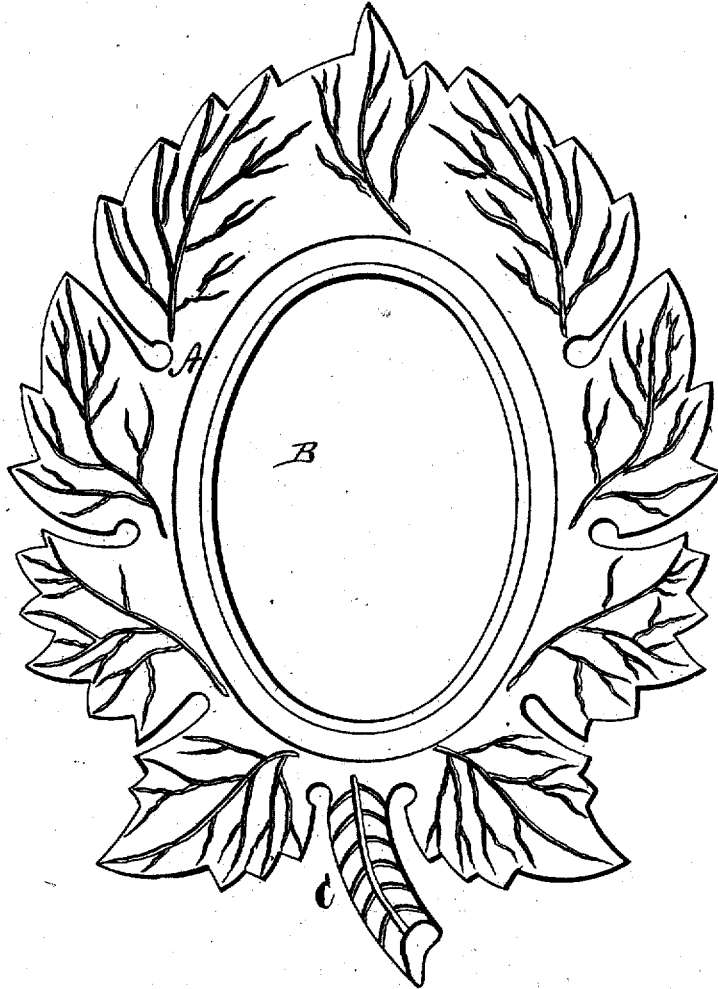

DESIGN FOR PICTURE-FRAMES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,574, dated August 24, 1875; application filed July 22, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ARTHUR B. DIMMETT, of Bloomington, in the county of McLean and in the State of Illinois, have invented a certain new and useful Design for Picture-Frames; and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, making a part of this specification.

My design is for a picture-frame, and is formed in the shape of a leaf, having a short stem at its bottom, the same being cast, carved, or otherwise formed of metal, wood, or other suitable material, and having an opening formed therein to receive a picture, as fully illustrated in the annexed drawing.

A represents a leaf, which may be made of

metal, wood, or other suitable material, either cast, carved, or otherwise formed, and provided at or near the center with an opening, B, of such size as to receive therein a picture, and at the bottom with a short stem, C.

What I claim is—

The design for picture-frames consisting of the leaf A, stem C, and sight-opening B, substantially as shown, and illustrated in the accompanying drawing.
