DESIGN FOR HANDLE FOR VASES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,575, dated August 24, 1875; application filed July 6,1875. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH W. FISKE, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have invented a Design for Handle for a Vase, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustra-

tion, to which reference is hereby made.

This belongs to that class of vases which is used as ornaments, and for containing plants, and the feature more especially constituting the novelty of this design is the handles, which, as shown in the illustration, are highly ornamental.

These handles, as shown in the illustration, are composed of an ornamental scroll, with a vertical portion made in imitation of a flower-

stalk, with leaves and a flower thereon, the stalk being connected to or formed with the scroll in such a manner as to have the appearance of being supported or held upright thereby.

The vase as a whole, with these handles attached, is exceedingly graceful, and presents a beautiful appearance.

What I claim as my invention is-The design for a handle for a vase, com-

posed of the scroll and stalk, substantially as described, and represented in the accompanying photographic illustration.
