DESIGN FOR A FAN.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,580**, dated August 24, 1875; application filed August 20, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

CASE C.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, SIMEON L. BARINDS, of the city of Memphis, county of Shelby and State of Tennessee, have invented a new and original Design for a Fan, of which the following is a specification:

The design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

An eagle is represented on one side of the fan with outspread wings and as grasping with his talons an olive branch and five arrows. The eagle stands upon a United States shield, and has a scroll in its mouth, upon which is inscribed the words and figures "Our Country, 1776 and 1876." The word "Centennial" is placed just over the eagle, and the letters "U. S." underneath the shield at the point

where the olive branch extends over the shield. The shield is the shield of the United States as it now is. The words and figures are, preferably, placed in semicircular form, as shown.

This design may be painted, printed, or otherwise formed upon the paper or other material that forms the fan.

I claim as my invention—

The design for a fan, composed, essentially, of the eagle, scroll, shield, arrows, and olive branches, grouped and arranged substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.
