

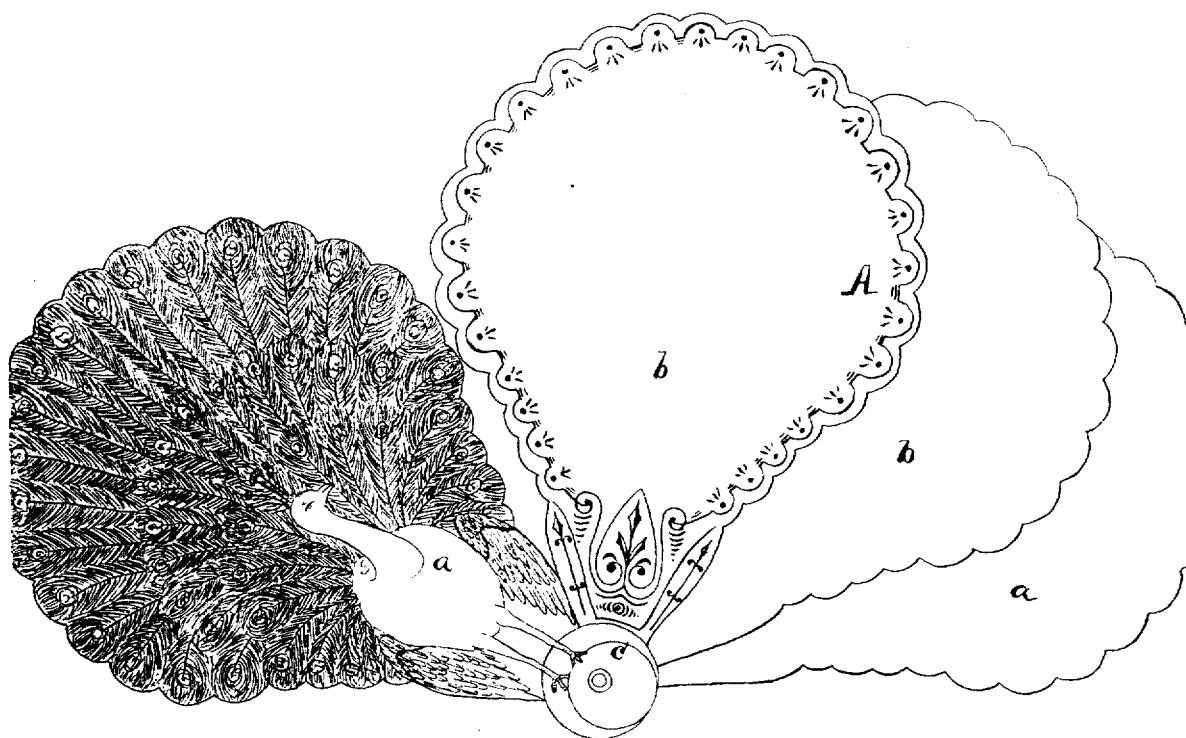

DESIGN FOR A DANCING-PROGRAMME.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,582**, dated August 24, 1875; application filed July 12, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, PHILIP HAKE, of Hoboken, in the county of Hudson and State of New Jersey, have originated a Design for Dancing-Programme, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, which represents a face view of my dancing-programme when the same is partly open.

This design consists in a peacock with a spread tail, which serves as an ornament for the covers of my dancing-programme.

In the drawing, the letter *A* designates a dancing-programme, which is composed of the covers *a a*, and the intermediate leaves *b b*.

The covers are ornamented each by the figure of a peacock with a spread tail, and the edges of the covers *a a* and of the leaves *b b* are scalloped, whereby an ornamental appearance is imparted to the same. The covers and leaves are pear-shaped with circular centers *c*, whereby my programme obtains a novel and ornamental appearance.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a dancing-programme, the covers of which are ornamented by the figures of peacocks, as shown and described.
