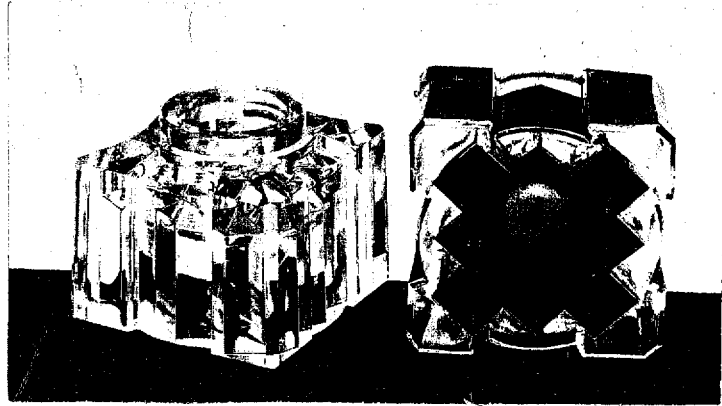

DESIGN FOR INKSTANDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,583**, dated August 31, 1875; application filed July 7, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, BLOOMFIELD BROWER, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a Design for Inkstands, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

In the photographic illustration, Figure 1 shows the exterior design, and Fig. 2 the interior design.

The distinctive features of my design are the polygon form of the exterior of the corners, (see A, Fig. 1,) the curved center face of the sides of the exterior, (see B, Fig. 1,) and the prismatic form of the sides of the interior. (See C C, Fig. 2.)

The exterior form may be used without the interior, or the interior without the exterior; but I prefer them together, as shown.

What I claim as my invention is—

1. In a design for an inkstand, the exterior form, consisting of the polygon corners A and curved face B, substantially as described and illustrated.

2. In a design for an inkstand, the interior prismatic form C, substantially as described and illustrated.
