

DESIGN FOR A SILK FABRIC.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,584, dated August 31, 1875; application filed August 14, 1875. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Joseph Coignet, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a Design for Silk Fabric, of which the following is a specification:

The object of my invention is to furnish a design for silk fabrics, which is fully represented in the accompanying specimen forming part of this specification.

The design consists of a square figure divided into four equal squares, of which the two diagonally opposite squares have a satin ground, and the other two a twilled ground.

A four-leafed flower figure extends symmetrically from the center of the main square into the smaller square, the leaf in each square being equal, and symmetrical to the leaves of the adjoining squares, and the leaves of the twilled ground made of satin body, and those on the satin ground with twilled body, the outlines of the figure being fringed and twilled, (sergé et colluté.) Each leaf has a center ro-

sette connected by a scroll at one side with the center, and by a three-foil leaf with the outer edge of the surrounding leaf.

The fabric may be made of two colors in warp and two in filling, or of one color in each, or of a different color in each, the arrangement of color being selected according to the purpose for which the fabric is to be employed.

I claim as my invention-

The design for silk fabric made of a main square divided into four equal squares, into which a four-leafed flower figure extends symmetrically from the center, being arranged with fringed edges alternately of twilled body on satin ground, and of satin body on twilled ground, as shown and described.
