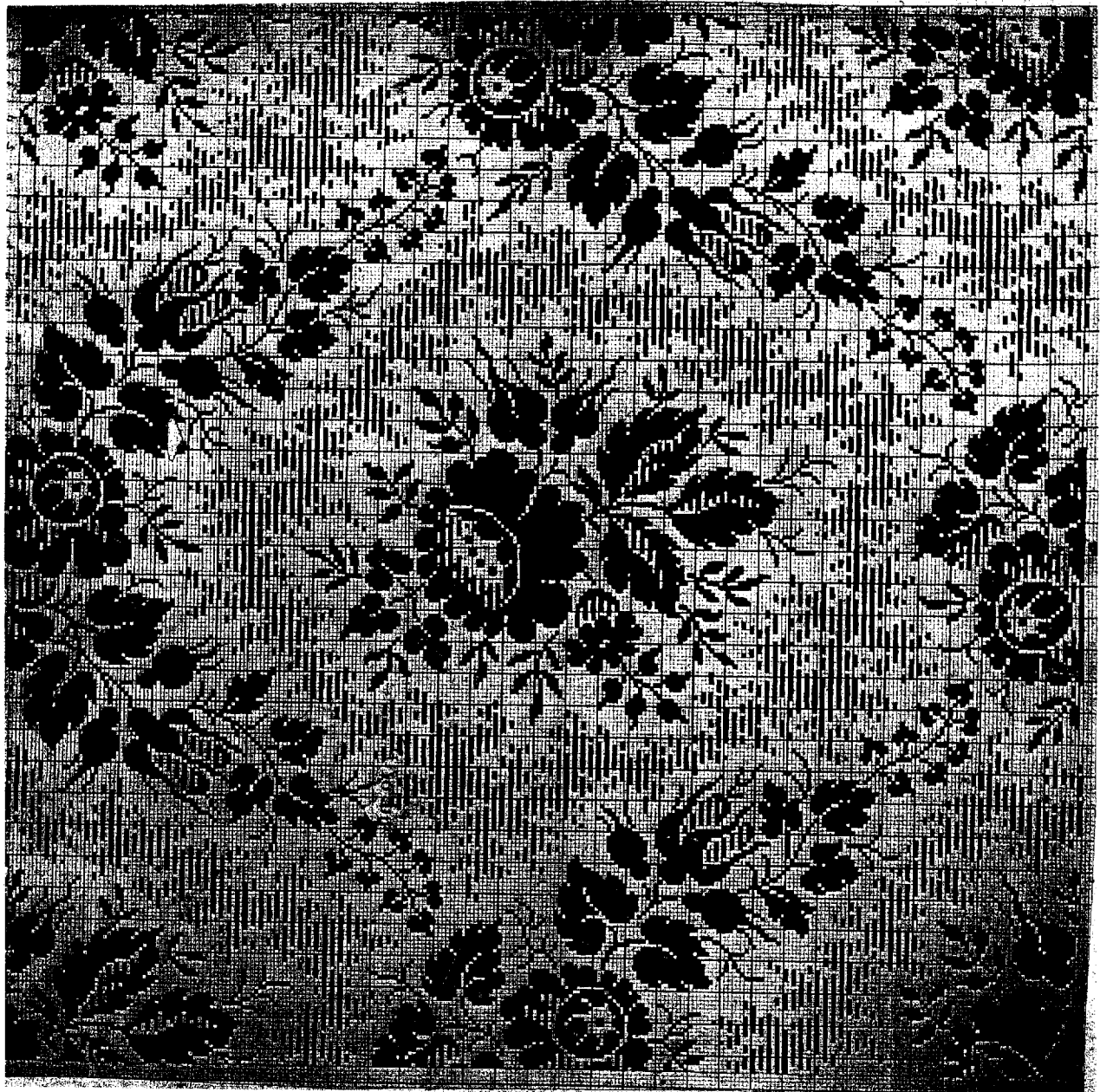

DESIGN FOR A CARPET.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,589, dated August 31, 1875; application filed August 21, 1875.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, ALFRED HEALD, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for a Carpet-Pattern, of which the following is a specification:

The accompanying photographic illustration represents sufficient of a carpet pattern to illustrate my design, the remainder being merely a repetition of that which appears.

The design is of a foliated character throughout, and comprises a central ornament, A, consisting of a group of flowers, leaves, and stems, arranged within a space bounded by portions of the bell-shaped figures B, each of which comprises a main group of flowers and leaves, from which extend two diverging sprays, D, comprising stems, leaves, and blossoms, as clearly shown in the drawing. The

ground between the central ornament A and the boundary of the space in which it is contained is occupied by minor ornamentation of a character too clearly shown to need description.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim—

The design for a carpet-pattern, as described, and as illustrated in and by the accompanying drawing.
