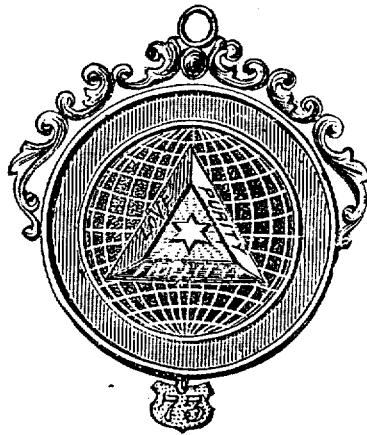

DESIGN FOR A BADGE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,591**, dated August 31, 1875; application filed August 9, 1875.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN S. LITTELL, of Newark, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have invented a Design for a Badge or Emblem for the Sons of Temperance, of which the following is a specification:

My invention consists of a design for a badge, the same being illustrated in the accompanying drawings, to which reference is made.

A represents the world—"the field of our labor;" B, a star lying on the world, illustrative of "the light which temperance has shed upon the world;" C, a triangle on the world,

and inclosing the star, representing "Purity," and "Fidelity," the cardinal principles of the Order; and D, a circle about the world, "the circle of fraternity encircling the world."

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a badge, composed of world A, star B, triangle C, and circle D, substantially as described, and illustrated in the accompanying drawing.
