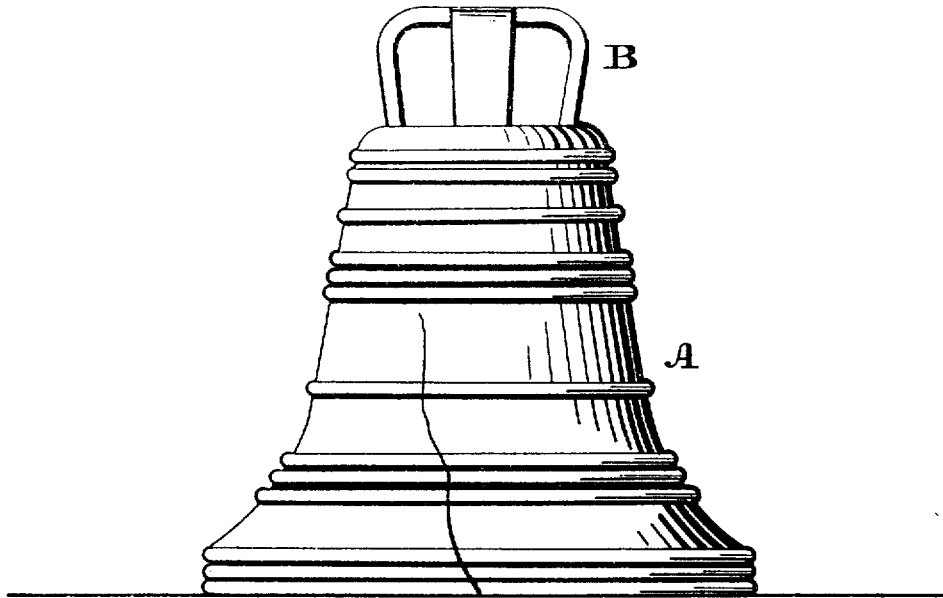
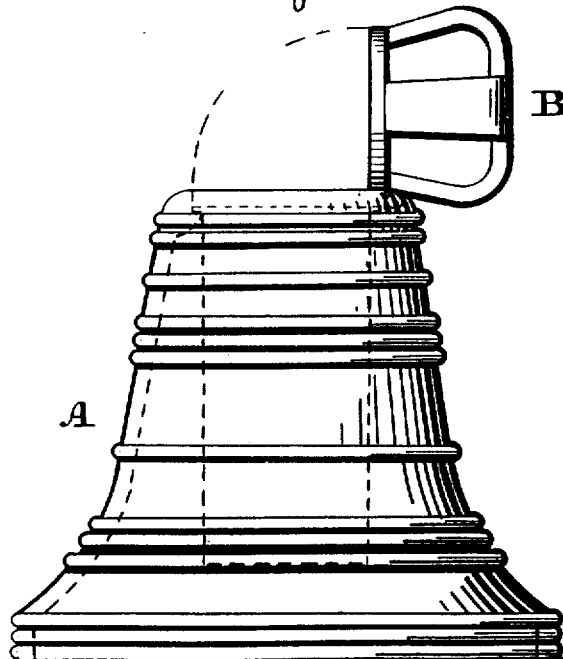

## DESIGN FOR MATCH-SAFES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,604**, dated September 7, 1875; application filed August 26, 1875.  
[Term of Patent  $3\frac{1}{2}$  years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, THOMAS B. HARKINS, of Bristol, in the county of Bucks and State of Pennsylvania, have originated a Design for Match-Safes, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making a part of this specification, in which—

A represents the body of the box, and B represents suspension-yokes at the top thereof. The yokes constitute the lid of the body.

The body A and yokes B are fac-similes of those of the Liberty Bell in the State House or Independence Hall at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for match-safe, of the form of the Liberty Bell, as shown and described.
