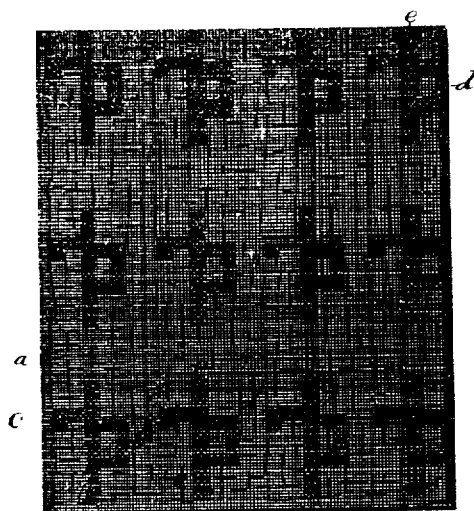

DESIGN FOR FABRICS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,636**, dated September 7, 1875; application filed August 30, 1875.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWARD C. CLARK, of Rockville, Tolland county, Connecticut, have invented a Design for Fabrics, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

The body or groundwork *a* of the cassimere is of any desired color or weave, and on the same at intervals I weave the monogram "76," the vertical or inclined parts of the "7," and the "6" being connected together, as shown, the top *c* of the "7" and the loop *d* of the "6" projecting from a common stem, *e*. The

top of the "7" and the loop of the "6" may be changed from the form shown, and be curved or otherwise shaped; and the ground of the fabric may be striped or checked, if desired.

I claim—

As a design for cassimere the monogram "76," as shown and described.
