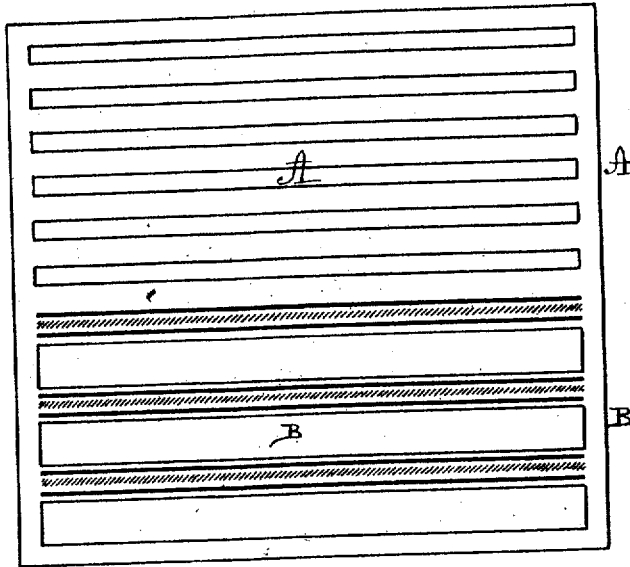
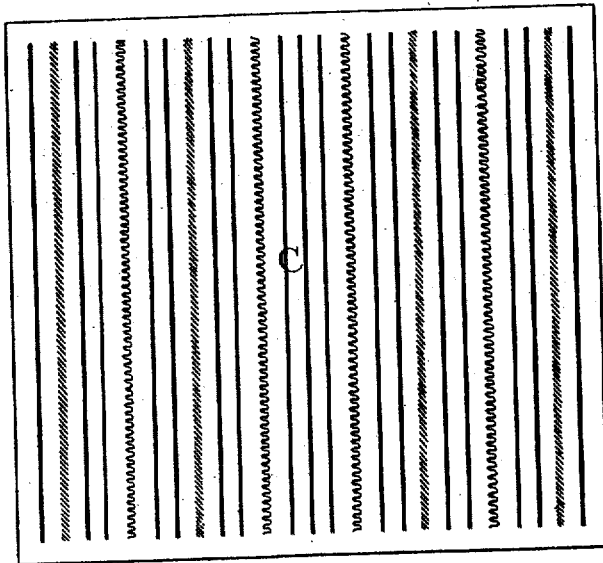

## DESIGN FOR SHAWLS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,643**, dated September 7, 1875; application filed June 23, 1873.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, HERRMANN BERG, of the city and county of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and useful Design for Shawls; and I do hereby declare the following to be a clear and exact description of the nature thereof, sufficient to enable others skilled in the art to which my invention appertains to fully understand the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawing which illustrates my invention.

My invention consists in a new and useful design for shawls, the same consisting of two distinct woven patterns on one side or face,

and a single woven pattern on the opposite side or face.

Referring to the drawing, A and B represent two patterns on one side of the shawl, and C a single pattern occupying the opposite side thereof.

I claim—

The design for a shawl, with two patterns, A B, on one side, and a single pattern, C, on the opposite side, as stated and shown.
