

DESIGN FOR A BOA.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,645, dated September 7, 1875; application filed August 28, 1875.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GILBERT H. PRINDLE, of Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia and in the State of Pennsylvania, have invented a certain new and original Design for Boas; and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making a part of this specification, in which is shown, in perspective, my improved boa.

The distinctive feature of my design consists in four or more rows of balls, A and A, each of which rows is formed upon or of one continuous roving, and is arranged parallel with and secured to the contiguous rows at the points of contact between their said balls, the whole forming a roll that has the same appearance upon each side, as shown. At

the ends of the boa, which are preferably somewhat less in diameter than the central portion, ribbons B and B, cords, or other similar appliances for fastening said boa around the neck of the user, may be attached, if desired.

Having thus fully set forth the nature of my invention, what I claim as new is—

The design for a boa, composed essentially of the rows of balls A and A, grouped together substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying drawing.
