

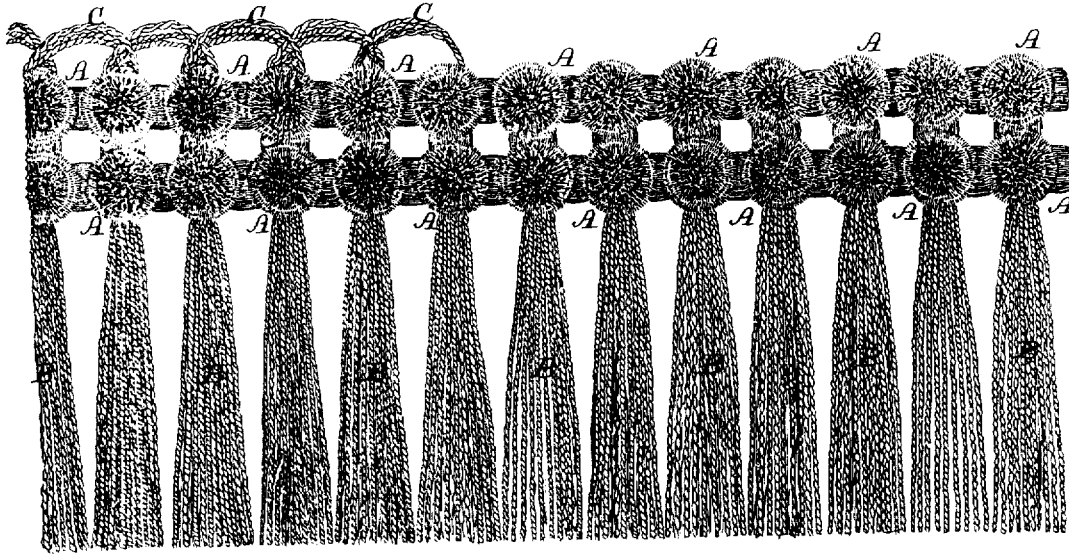

DESIGN FOR A TRIMMING.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,646**, dated September 7, 1875; application filed August 28, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GILBERT H. PRINDLE, of Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia and in the State of Pennsylvania, have invented a certain new and original Design for Trimmings; and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making a part of this specification, in which is shown, in plan view, my improved trimming.

The distinctive feature of my design consists of two rows of balls, A and A, each of which rows is formed upon or of one continuous roving, arranged in parallel lines, and connected together at their points of contact, and a row of tassels, B and B, that are secured to and depending from the lower row of said balls, and form a fringe, the whole having the form shown. A series of loops, C and C,

may be added to or omitted from the upper row of balls, as desired.

Having thus fully set forth the nature of my invention, what I claim as new is—

1. The design for trimming for garments, composed of the balls A and A and tassels B and B, substantially of the form described, and shown in the accompanying drawing.

2. The design for trimming for garments, composed of the balls A and A, tassels B and B, and loops C and C, formed substantially as described and shown.
