

DESIGN FOR A CASTING.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,649, dated September 14, 1875; application filed August 9, 1875.

[Term of Patent 3½ sears.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALBERT P. REGER, of the city and county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have originated a Design for Casting, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

Figure 1 is a front view, and Fig. 2 a rear, of a building.

A represents the body of the building, and B a steeple thereupon, the contour and appearance of the whole being similar to that of

the State House or Independence Hall Building, in the city of Philadelphia.

This ornament is especially designed for parlors or mantels, and will be cast or stamped so as to be stood on a mantel, pedestal, table, or other proper support, after the manner of statuary.

What I claim as my invention, is-

The design for a casting, representing in form and appearance the building known as Independence Hall, in the city of Philadelphia, substantially as described and shown.
