

DESIGN FOR GRIDIRONS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8.650, dated September 14, 1875; application filed June 23, 1873.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WALTER P. WARREN, of the city of Troy, in the county of Rensselaer and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original ornamental Design for Gridirous, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying photograph of a cast-iron gridiron, which embodies the distinguishing feature of my invention.

This ornamental design for gridirons consists of the two crossing united series of reversely curved bars C, all shaped and arranged together so as to form the series of apertures A, each having reversely curved and uni-

formly-similar sides, and beak-shaped corners, and the whole presenting the particular ornamental appearance represented in the aforesaid photograph.

What I claim as my invention is—

The ornamental design for a gridiron, composed of the united series of reversely-curved bars C, forming the series of apertures A, having reversely-curved sides and beak-shaped corners, as shown and described.
