


MORITZ ISIDOR AND FERDINAND HEIN, OF NEW YORK, N. Y.

DESIGN FOR CAPS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,651, dated September 14, 1875; application filed July 30, 1875.

[Term of Patent 34 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, MORITZ ISIDOR and FERDINAND HEIN, both of the city, county, and State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern for Caps, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The nature of our design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, in which—

Figure 1 represents a side view. Fig. 2 is

a plan or top view.

Similar letters indicate corresponding parts. This invention relates to a cap, which is ornamented by a series of depressed scallops extending around its crown, and also on its peak or visor. The lower part of the crown is also ornamented by horizontal depressed bands, the annular space between which is occupied by oblique depressed bars. The top of the crown is ornamented by a depressed star.

In the drawing, the letter A designates a cap, the crown of which is ornamented by a series of depressed scallops, a a, extending round said crown in circular lines. The visor B of the cap is also ornamented by depressed scallops b. The lower portion of the crown

is ornamented by two depressed stripes or bands, c c, leaving an annular space, d, which is ornamented by oblique depressed bars e e, extending from one of the stripes c to the other. On the top of the crown is formed a depressed star, f.

What we claim as new, and desire to secure

by Letters Patent, is-

1. The design for the crown of a cap having the depressed scallops a a, as herein shown and described.

2. The design for the crown of a cap having the depressed stripes cc, the oblique depressed cross-bars ec, and the depressed scallops ac, as herein shown and described.

3. The design for the crown of a cap having the depressed star f on the top thereof, and the depressed scallops a a, substantially as herein shown and described.
