

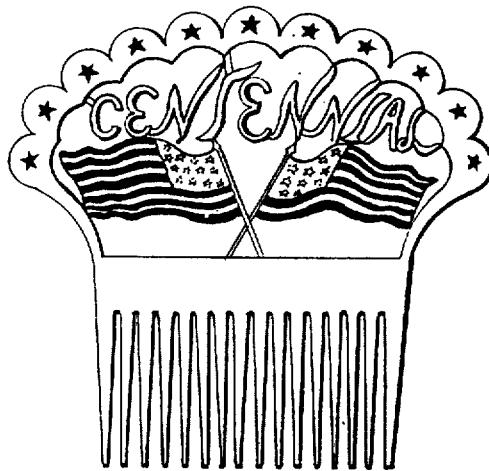

DESIGN FOR A BACK-COMB.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,653**, dated September 14, 1875; application filed September 8, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM C. SHIMONECK, of Washington, District of Columbia, have invented a Design for a Ladies' Back-Comb; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full and correct description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, in which—

The figure fully represents the nature of my design, which consists of a ladies' back-comb, made of any suitable material, and ornamented, either in relief or otherwise, by the word "Centennial" sprung over two American flags with their staffs crossed. The crest of the comb is scalloped, having a star in each scallop. The distinctive character of my design is the figures upon the comb, as represented in the drawings.

Having thus described my design, what I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The ornamental design for a comb, composed essentially of the word "Centennial" placed over crossed flags, and beneath a scalloped border containing stars, substantially in the manner above described and shown.
