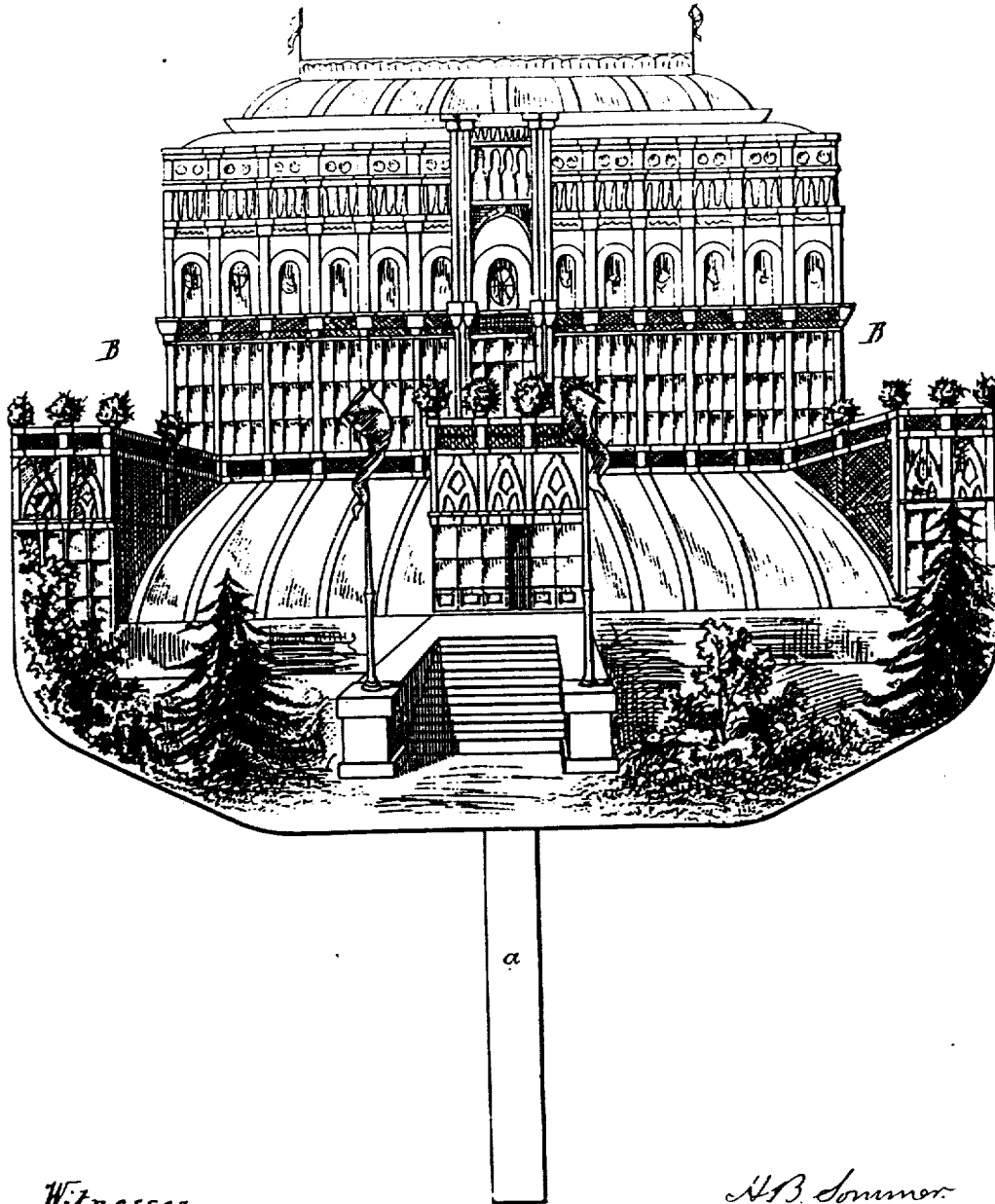

DESIGN FOR A FAN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,654, dated September 14, 1875; application filed August 27, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY B. SOMMER, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for a Fan, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a fan is fully illustrated in the accompanying drawing, in which—

a is the handle, and *B* the body, of the fan; and the design consists in making the said body *B* a representation of a front view of the Horticultural Hall of the Centennial Exhibition Buildings, the outline of the fan coinciding with the outline of the building.

I claim—

1. The design for a fan the body of which has a representation of Horticultural Hall of the Centennial Buildings at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

2. The design for a fan having the configuration shown in and by the accompanying illustration.
