

DESIGN FOR CIGAR-BOX.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,657, dated September 21, 1875; application filed August 26, 1875. [Term of Patent 34 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MAX HILSON, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a Design for Cigar-Boxes, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully illustrated

and represented in the accompanying draw-

ings, to which reference is made.

The box, in plan, is of rectangular form, but has one of its sides higher than the other with the top a sloping downward from the higher b to the lower side c, the ends thus presenting an irregular rectangle, as shown in the draw-

The top may be straight from the one side to the other, as shown in Fig. 1, when in its sloping position just described, or it may be made convex to a slight degree, as shown in Fig. 2, or somewhat concave, as represented in Fig. 3, these slight modifications in the general contour making no change in the nature of my said design.

What I claim as my invention is-

The design for cigar-boxes in which the one side of the box is higher than the other side, with the top sloping downward from the former to the latter.
