

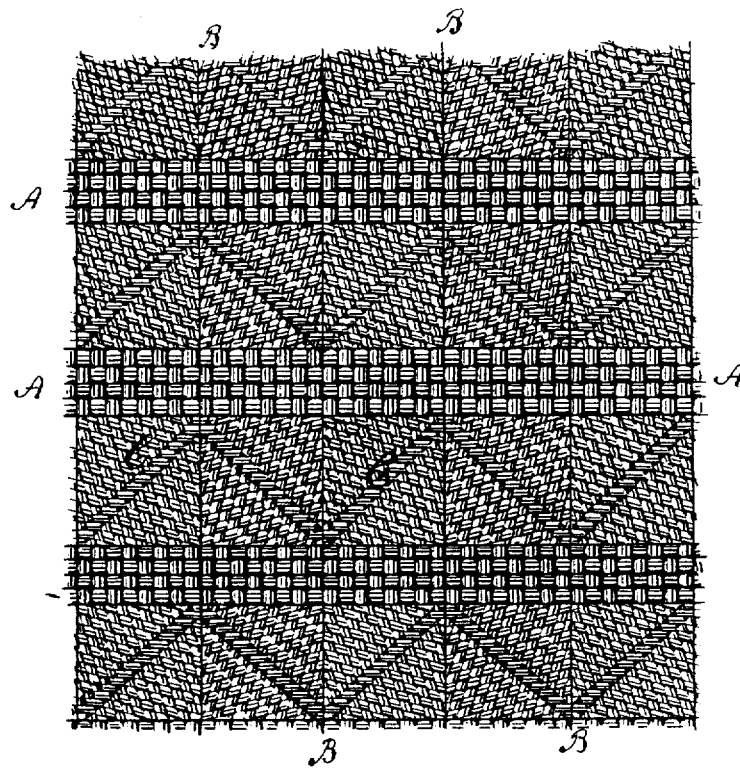

DESIGN FOR FANCY WORSTED OR WOOLEN FABRICS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,658**, dated September 21, 1875; application filed July 14, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, AARON JEWELL, of Lawrence, in the county of Essex and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new and Improved Design for Fancy Worsted or Woolen Fabrics; and I do hereby declare that the following specification, taken in connection with the drawings making a part of the same, is a full, clear, and exact description thereof.

The effect of my novel design will be apparent from an inspection of the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made. Said effect is produced by the arrangement of the corded or fancy woven stripes A, running lengthwise of the fabric, intersected at regular intervals by the thread lines B, running crosswise of the fabric, thereby producing the figures of square C. These squares are to be filled in with diagonal shade lines as shown.

The longitudinal stripes, the transverse thread lines, or the diagonal shade lines, may be woven in any variety of pattern or combination of colors for giving varied effect to the design, the distinctive character of which is found in the arrangement of the stripes A, the thread lines B, and the diagonally-shaded squares C.

What I claim is—

The design for fancy worsted or woolen fabrics, substantially as described, and shown in the drawings.
