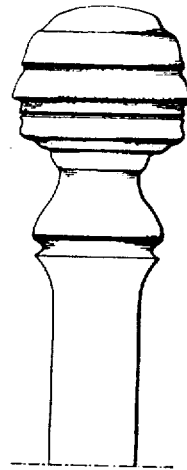

DESIGN FOR A CANE OR OTHER HANDLE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,662**, dated September 21, 1875; application filed July 30, 1875.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS R. LOVETT, of Mount Airy, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for Knob or Handle, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a handle or knob is fully illustrated in the accompanying drawing, in which—

Figure 1 is a side view of the handle of a cane made according to my design. Fig. 2 is a diagram illustrating the effect produced by the design, which consists in making the handle or knob of such a form that when it is presented to a bright light it will cast on a plane surface a shadow representing a sil-

houette profile of the bust of General Washington, as shown in Fig. 2.

I claim—

The design for a knob or handle, substantially as shown or described, so that it will cast a shadow representing a profile of the bust of General Washington.
