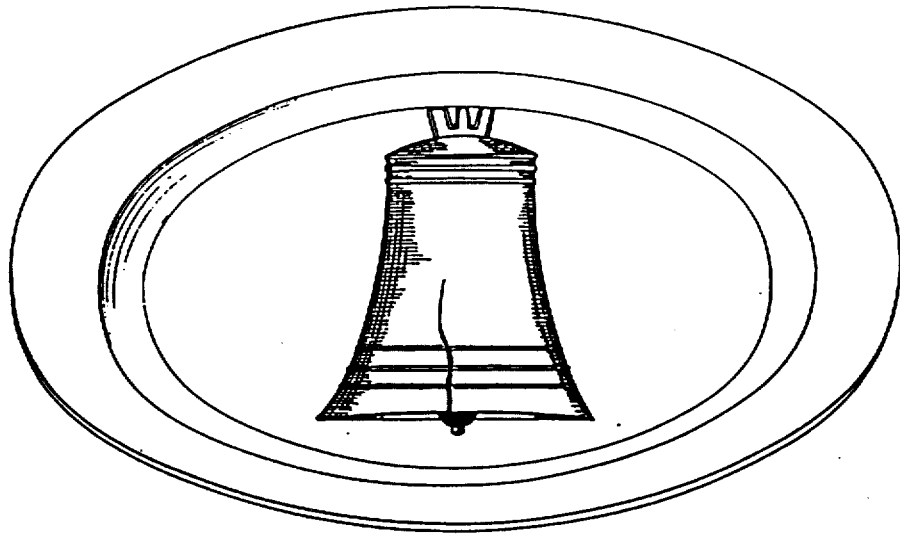

## DESIGN FOR GLASSWARE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,663, dated September 28, 1875; application filed September 4, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JAMES C. GILL, of Pittsburg, in the county of Allegheny and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and useful Improved Design for Glassware; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part of this specification, which shows my improved design pressed upon a flat dish.

It consists of a representation of the Independence Bell upon glass articles.

I do not limit myself to flat dishes, but form this design on a full line or set of glassware bowls, cream-pitchers, spoon-holders, goblets,

&c. (Upon the latter-named class of glassware the design will be formed upon the side, or some other prominent portion of the article.)

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The new and improved design consisting of a glass article having the representation of the Independence Bell formed thereon.
