



## DESIGN FOR HANDLES FOR DINNER, TEA, AND TOILET SETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8.665**, dated September 28, 1875; application filed July 15, 1875. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES FIELD HAVI-LAND, of Paris, France, have originated and made a Design for Dinner, Tea, and Toilet Sets, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, which forms a part of this specification.

This design relates especially to the production of an ornamental handle for dishes, such as dinner, tea, and toilet sets; and the nature of the design will be fully understood by reference to the drawing and description.

In the accompanying drawing, Figure 1 is a side view of a covered dish, provided with handles containing or embodying my design; and Fig. 2 is a top view of the same.

A designates a vegetable-dish, and B the cover thereof, which dish and cover are provided with handles C, fashioned according to my design. The general shape of the handle is that of a thin parallelogram, like lug or

projection a, the ends being preferably beveled as shown at  $a^1$ . The sides of the handle are provided with panel-like recesses or openings b b. The top edge of the handle is surmounted by a leaf, or foliate ornamental coping, d, which latter assists the hold of the thumb and finger upon the handle.

I have shown the handle as also provided with beads  $a^2$ , b', and c', and with a panel, c; but these are not necessary, though desirable adjuncts to my design.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for the handle of a dish, consisting of the parallelogram-like projection a, having panel-like openings b b, and also having its upper edge surmounted by a leaf or foliate ornamental coping, d, substantially as herein shown and described.
