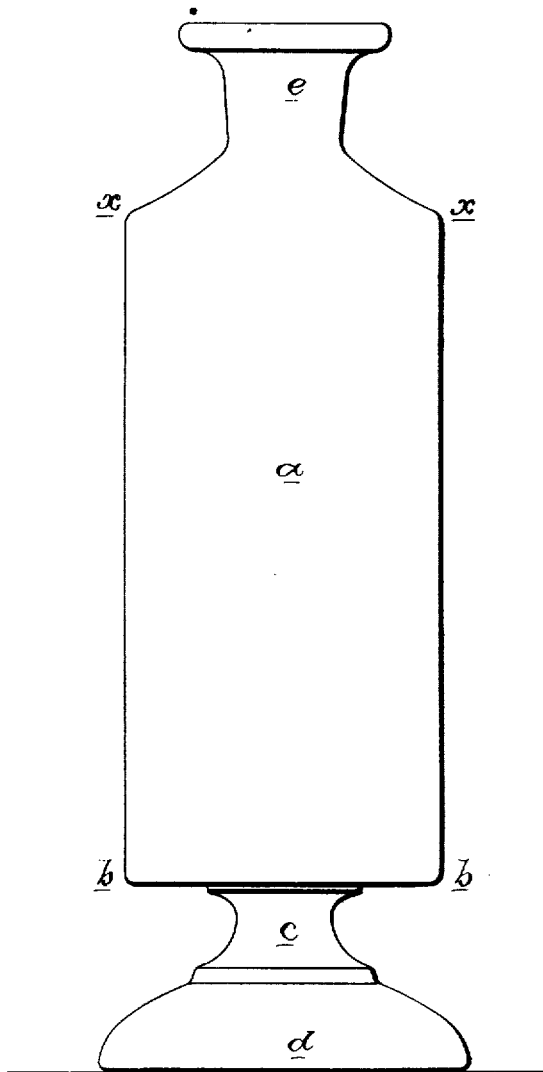

DESIGN FOR DRUGGISTS' SHOP-BOTTLE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,671**, dated September 28, 1875; application filed September 22, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

CASE B.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM R. WARNER, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for a Shop-Bottle for Druggists, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a shop-bottle for druggists is fully represented in and by the accompanying drawing.

The body of the bottle is cylindrical, and terminates abruptly below at *b* where it meets the base, the latter consisting of the stem *c* and foot *d*. The body of the bottle has also an abrupt termination, *x*, at the top above, which is the neck *e*.

I claim—

The design for a shop-bottle for druggists, substantially as described, and as represented in and by the accompanying drawing.
