

DESIGN FOR FLOOR OIL-CLOTHS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,674, dated October 5, 1875; application filed September 22, 1875.

[Term of Patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH BARRETT, of New York city, New York, have invented or produced a Design for a Floor Oil-Cloth Pattern, of which the following is a specification:

The accompanying photograph shows sufficient of an oil cloth to illustrate my design.

The main feature of the design consists of an oblong ornament, A, having scroll-like ends, which merge into figures B, the figures A and B in the complete pattern inclosing a space which contains the figure D.

The figure A has interior ornamentation a and a border, b, both of a foliated character, and too clearly shown to need minute descrip-

tion.

The figure B has a central ornament, d, of square outline, ornamented both in the inte-

rior and on the sides, as shown.

The figure D has a border, e, and its interior is divided by a series of stripes, f, into a center space, g, and corner spaces h, both center and corner spaces being provided with ornamentation of a character too clearly shown to need description.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim-

1. The design for the figure A, with its scroll-like ends, its interior foliated ornament, and foliated border, as shown and described.

2. The design comprising the figures A and the figures B, ornamented as shown and described.

3. The design for the figure D, its border e, stripes f, and spaces g and h, ornamented as shown.

4. The design for the whole pattern comprising the figures A, B, and D, substantially as shown, and as illustrated in and by the accompanying drawing.
