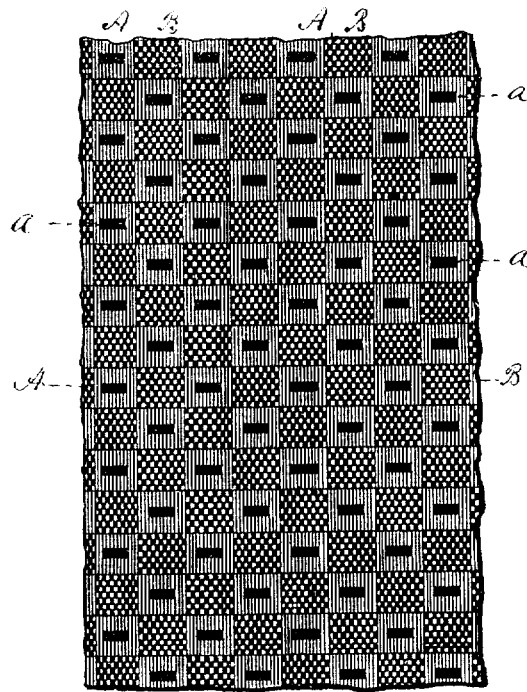

DESIGN FOR FANCY CASSIMERES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,676**, dated October 5, 1875; application filed September 18, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FREDERICK SNOW BOSWORTH, of the city and county of Providence, and State of Rhode Island, have invented a new and Improved Design for Fancy Cassimeres; and I do hereby declare that the following specification, taken in connection with the drawings, is a full, clear, and exact description thereof.

The new design which is the subject of this patent is produced by the combination of the peculiarly-composed squares A and B, which are arranged in a checker-board pattern. The squares A are of plain weaving, relieved by a short transverse bar, *a*. The squares B are of basket-weaving, in strong contrasting light and shade.

The design may be represented in any variety or combination of colors that may be preferred for bringing out the effect which results from the combination of squares thus composed.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for fancy cassimeres, substantially as described, and shown in the drawings.
