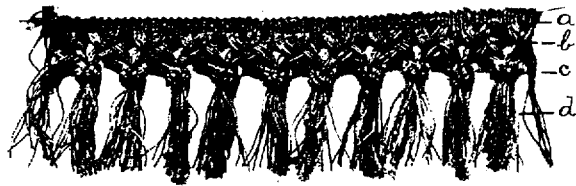

## DESIGN FOR DRESS-TRIMMING.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,686**, dated October 5, 1875; application filed September 13, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, SALLIE McLAUGHLIN, of the city and county of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a new and useful Design for Dress-Trimming, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

Strands that extend from the head *a* are loosely plaited below the same, so as to form a series of flat crossed bodies, *b*, and a number of strands from one body are united to a number

thereof from the adjacent body, which, when a head or tuft, *c*, is fixed to said united strands, form the tassels or pendants *d*. The design will be found to be tasty and attractive.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for dress-trimming, in which the strands from the head *a* are plaited, so as to form flat cross-bodies *b*, and a number of strands from one body join a number of those from the adjacent body, and, united by a head or tuft, *c*, constitute throughout the tassels or pendants *d*, as shown and described.
