DESIGN FOR A BUST, (SHAKESPEARE.)

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,688**, dated October 5, 1875; application filed September 6, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM PAGE, of the city and county and State of New York, have originated a new Design for a Bust of William Shakespeare, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustrations making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustrations, to which reference is made. This bust is designed with the aid of the mask known as the "death-mask," now in Darmstadt, Germany.

Among the distinctive characteristics of my

design, as set forth in this specification and illustrations, the existence of a scar over the right eyebrow, and a corrugation or irregularity between the inner hairs of the left eyebrow and the nose, are fully demonstrated.

I am aware that other designs for busts of Shakespeare have been made, and I do not claim them.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a bust of William Shakespeare, substantially as described and shown.
