

DESIGN FOR A FLOOR OIL-CLOTH.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,689**, dated October 5, 1875; application filed September 22, 1875. [Term of Patent 3\frac{1}{2} years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Frank. H. Randall, of Camden, New Jersey, have invented or produced a Design for a Floor Oil-Cloth Pattern, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a floor oil-cloth pattern is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration; and consists of a number of octagonal figures, A and B, and square figures D, as fully shown.

The interiors of both the figures B and D are ornamented with irregular line work of different shades, so that each of these figures presents a veined appearance, and a mottled appearance is imparted to the figure A by the use of irregular shaded spots.

Irrespective of the colors employed in producing my design, I claim---

The design for a floor oil-cloth pattern, comprising the octagonal figures A and B and the square figures D, ornamented substantially as described, and as illustrated in and by the accompanying drawing.
