

DESIGN FOR WALL-POCKETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8.702, dated October 5, 1875; application filed September 9, 1875. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Jennie C. Lamm, of Hopedale, in the county of Tazewell, in the State of Illinois, have originated a new and useful Design for Bracket Knife-Boxes, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying illustration or drawing, making part of this specification.

This invention relates to a new knife-box, which can be suspended from a wall or other support, and which in appearance is ornamental and convenient for use.

The accompanying drawing fully illustrates my invention.

A represents the back part of the frame or bracket, which has holes a a, by which it is secured to hooks or nails in the wall. B is the box secured upon the frame A, as shown,

and supported by a projecting bracket, b. C is the cover of the box, and d e are divisions in the latter, by which three compartments are formed, one for the knives, the second for forks, and the third for spoons.

The back frame A and bracket b are carved as shown, and the box B has a scalloped under edge.

I claim as my invention-

The design for a bracket knife-box shown, consisting of the carved back plate A, of the shape described, bearing upon its front the rectangular receptacle B, supported by the carved bracket b, substantially as shown and described.
