

DESIGN FOR AN ADVERTISING-DESK.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,703, dated October 5, 1875; application filed September 4, 1875.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH S. MORGAN, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a new and original Advertising-Desk, of which the following is a specification:

The accompanying illustration represents fully the nature of my design for an advertis-

ing-desk for hotels, public halls, &c.

The design consists of a central panel-frame with symmetrical side panel-frames, which are made with a square base, pyramidal sash-frames, and with top pedestals having molded can-nicces.

A, in the illustration, represents the central, and B the side, panel-frames, which have one common base part, C, of greatest width, that carries the pyramidal sash-frames D, the central one of which is higher than the side frames. On the top of the sash-frames D are placed

the vertical pedestals E, of which the central one is separated by suitable spaces from the side pedestals. The pedestals are arranged with ornamentally-molded cap-pieces F, of which the middle is higher than the outer one, and mounted by an eagle with spread wings. The panel-frames are ornamented in artistic manner, and made use of for the purposes of the desk.

I claim as my invention-

The design for an advertising-desk, having central and side panel-frames, composed of a square base, pyramidal sash-frames, and vertical separated pedestals, with ornamental cap-moldings, substantially as shown and described.
