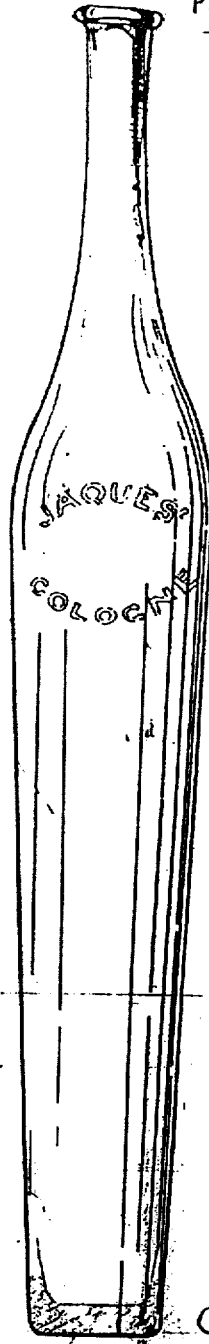

GEORGE JÁQUES, OF BOSTON, MASSACHUSETTS.

DESIGN FOR BOTTLES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,708**, dated October 11, 1875; application filed September 8, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE JÁQUES, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have originated and designed a Bottle, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the drawing accompanying and forming part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, in which—

A is the neck of the bottle; B, the swell or enlargement, and C the base.

This bottle is intended for cologne or other perfumes, and is to be placed in a suitable stand on the toilet-table. The form is narrow, elongated, and cylindrical, the diameter being largest at the point B near the neck,

from which point there is a gradual taper to the base. The neck is also long and narrow.

The bottle is blown from white or any other colored glass, and the base is flat, so that the bottle can stand upright. Upon the surface of the bottle, in raised letters, are the words "Jáques' Cologne;" but these need not be used.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a bottle, substantially as described.
