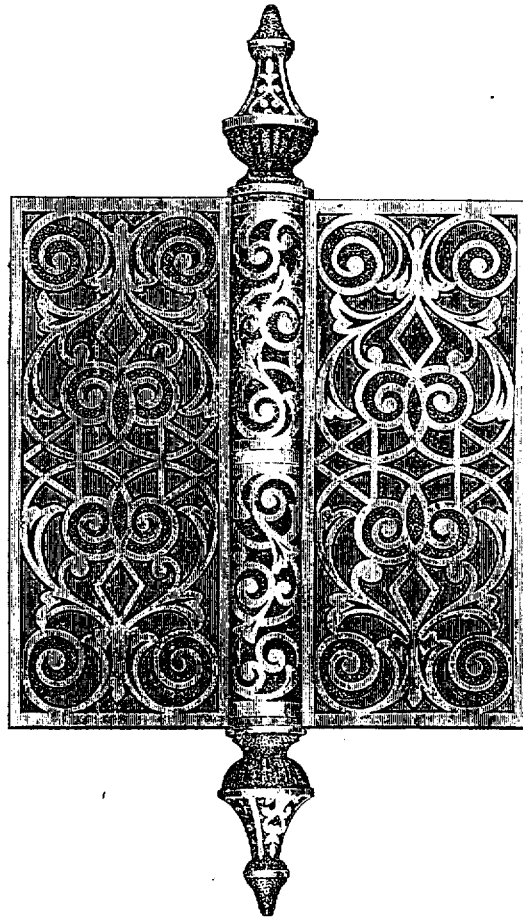
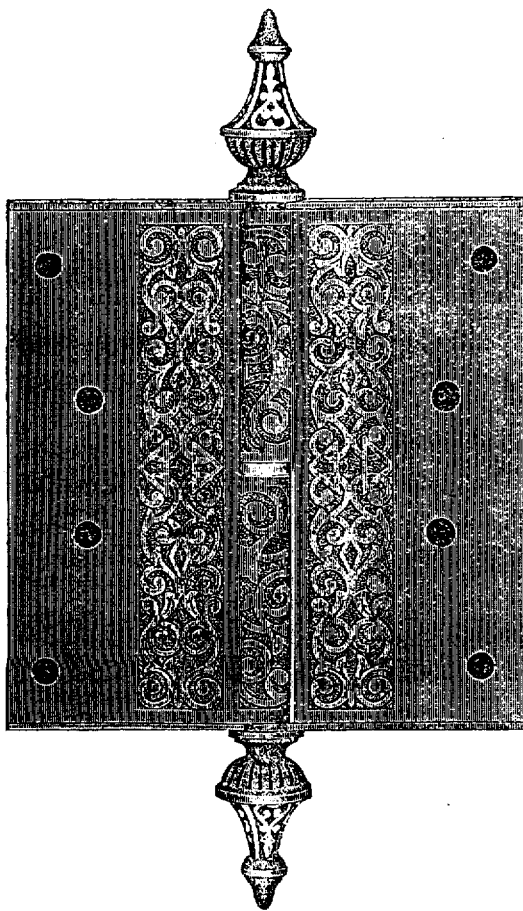

DESIGN FOR BUTT-HINGES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,710**, dated October 11, 1875; application filed September 23, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, E. J. STEELE, of Westville, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Butt-Hinge; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent, in—

Figure 1, face view; Fig. 2, rear view.

This invention relates to a design for the ornamentation of butt-hinges; and it consists, first, in the ornamentation of the face; second, in the ornamentation of the rear; and, third, in the configuration of the tips, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

The face has a plain raised edge, forming a panel, which is filled by a tracery of interwoven scroll-work, as shown in the accompanying illustration. On the rear, that portion of the butt which is exposed is formed with a sunken panel, and in this panel is a tracery or succession of scroll-work in relief, as shown in the accompanying illustration. The tips

consist of a base, the body resting thereon, which is of semi-spherical form, of reed-work, surmounted by a plain band, and from which the tip contracts in a concave curved form to a final tip, which, in outline, is substantially that of the tip below.

I claim—

1. The design for the face of butt-hinges, consisting of the raised edge and interwoven scroll-work ornamentation in relief, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

2. The design for the rear of butt-hinges, consisting of the sunken panel on the exposed portion, filled with a tracery of scroll-work in relief, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

3. The design for tips for butt-hinges, consisting of the base-reeded semi-spherical body, and surmounted by a plain band, and contracted to the tip, as shown in the accompanying illustration.
