

DESIGN FOR A FOUNTAIN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8.713. dated October 11, 1875; application filed July 24, 1875.

[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM TWEEDDALE, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Fountain, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying print of a wood-engrav-

ing, to which reference is made.

Above the upper bowl A is a center-piece, formed of the leaves B C, bearing the flower-shaped top D and jet-piece E. The edge of the basin is ornamented with leaf-points F and J, and the under side with the leaves H, serolls I, flowers G, bead K, shields L, and flowers M. The column which supports the upper basin has stays or braces N, having leaf-ornamentation O and Q; also, the scales R on the face and flower-shaped side ornaments P and between these braces the surface is ornamented with the double-pointed raised figures S, T, and U. The principal basin has the border of the top ornamented with the leaves V, oval figures W, and the figures X. The under side of the basin has the leaves Y Z, lyreshaped figures a, b, and d, and the oval bosses The standard for the lower basin has a polygonal base in two vertical sections, f, and two tapered sections, gh, surmounted by a circular top, i, and ornamented by the points jand beads k. Above the base it is fluted, and has the leaves l, oval bosses m n, and curved ribs p_i and above the fluted portion it has shields r, plain ribs s, and a bead-molding, t. The pedestal has the paneled figure A', vordered by the ornamental corner posts C', beaded top molding D', and base-molding E' on some of its sides, and other sides have the scroll-bracket F', ornamented by the figure-

head G', rosette H', leaves I' and J', and the figures K'.

I claim as a design for fountains—

1. The center-piece of leaves B C, and flowers D E in the upper bowl, as set forth.

2. The border ornamentation F J of the upper basin, as set forth.

3. The side ornamentation H, I, G, K, and L of the upper basin, as set forth.

4. The leaf ornamentation O and Q, also the scales R and the side ornaments P of the braces N, as set forth.

5. The double-pointed raised figures S, T, and U, for the standard ornaments, as set forth.

6. The border ornaments V, W, and X of

the lower basin, as set forth.

7. The leaves Y Z, lyre-shaped figures a, b, and d, and the oval bosses e, for the side ornamentation of the lower base, as set forth.

8. The polygonal base of vertical sections f, tapered sections g h, and circular top i, as set forth.

9. The fluted standard ornamented with leaves l, oval bosses m n, and curved ribs p, as set forth.

10. The shields r, plain ribs s, and bead-molding t, for the top of the bowl-standard, as set forth.

11. The paneled figure A' in the pedestal, bordered by the ornamental corner-posts C', beaded top molding D, and base-molding E', as set forth.

12. The scroll-brackets F, ornamented with the figure-head G', rosette H', leaves I' and J', and the figures K', as set forth.
