

DESIGN FOR SHIRT-BOSOM.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8.715, dated October 11, 1875; application filed September 28, 1875.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES H. HORSFALL, of New York, in the county and State of New York, have invented an Improved Design for Shirt-Bosoms; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, which represents a front view of a shirt bosom embracing my improved design.

The bosom A has two plaits, a a, in its center, running close to and parallel with each other from the bottom to a point, b, somewhat above its midlength, from which point they

diverge toward the neck and shoulders in the form of two sides of a triangle, as shown at a', leaving a plain smooth surface, c, between them.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a shirt-bosom, substantially as herein described, and represented in the accompanying drawing.
