

A represents the cover of the inkstand: B. well are made of such a configuration as to scribing witnesses. represent a bell, with lugs or projections on top thereof, and with a crack extending from near its upper portions to the rim thereof. It also has bands or rings extending about its circumference, and may be provided with an inscrip-

hung bell.

What I claim as my invention is-

A design for an inkstand consisting of a well and cover made in imitation of a bell, and the ornamented base, substantially as shown and described.
