

DESIGN FOR MONUMENTS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,717, dated October 11, 1875; application filed September 18, 1875. [Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM T. PRICE, of Circleville, in the county of Pickaway and in the State of Ohio, have invented a certain new and useful Design for Monuments; and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, making a part of this specification.

My design consists in the form of a monument, substantially as shown in the accompa-

nying drawings.

A represents the ground-base, which is or may be of a single piece of stone, upon which, near each end, are bases B B, which support upright columns C C. Each column has a cap, D D, of the form substantially as shown,

and resting on these caps is an arch, E, on the top of which is placed a suitable design, such as an urn, a cross, statue, or other configuration.

What I claim is—

The design for monuments composed of the ground-base A, the bases B B thereon, the upright columns C C, the caps D D, and the arch E, having a figure on its top, all substantially as shown and set forth.
