DESIGN FOR STATUARY.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8.720. dated October 19, 1875; application filed September 22, 1875. [Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I. John Rogers, of the city of New York, and county and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Piece of Statuary, of which the following is a specification:

It represents Washington standing against a wall, on which lies his cloak. His right elbow rests on the wall, and he holds his hat in that hand, while his gloves are in the left.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustrations, to which reference is made.

I claim as my invention— The design for a piece of statuary, as shown.
