DESIGN FOR EMBROIDERY-PATTERNS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8.721, dated October 19, 1875; application filed September 20, 1875.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM STEINHAUS, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have originated and Designed a Pattern-Chart for Crochet or Embroidery Work, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying print, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying printed illustration, to

which reference is made.

The design is for a round tidy, worked in squares. The central group consists of figures of hearts A, crosses B, and anchors C, all of which figures converge toward the center.

Surrounding the central figures is a round border of eight two-armed ornaments, almost touching one another. The design is finished by a narrow circular line.

The design may be executed on a larger scale within an increased number of squares. I reserve the right to paint the figures and the border in different colors for embroidery-work.

I claim-

The design for embroidery-pattern, as above described, and illustrated by accompanying print.
