DESIGN FOR EMBROIDERY-PATTERNS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,722, dated October 19, 1875; application filed September 20, 1875. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM STEINHAUS, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern Chart for Crochet or Embroidery Work, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying print, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying printed illustration, to

which reference is made.

The design is worked in squares, and consists of a body and a border. The body represents a little chicken with undeveloped wings, which seems to be intently regarding one-half of an egg-shell, the other half resting on its back. Above the chicken is the motto "Most Strange" and below it "Most Queer." The border consists of oval figures, containing smaller ovals in the center, and small branched ornaments in each corner extending toward the central figure.

The design may be worked on a larger scale within an increased number of squares.

I reserve the right to reverse the position of the little chicken, to leave out the mottos, to increase or diminish the number of ovalshaped figures; also, to paint the figure and the border in different colors for embroiderywork.

I claim-

The design for embroidery pattern, consisting of a representation of a little chicken, regarding part of an egg-shell, (the other part resting on its back,) and with the mottos "Most Strange," "Most Queer," all surrounded by a border of oval figures, as above described, and illustrated by the accompanying print.
