## DESIGN FOR EMBROIDERY-PATTERNS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,725, dated October 19, 1875; application filed September 20, 1875. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, WILLIAM STEINHAUS, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have originated and Designed a Pattern-Chart for Crochet or Embroidery Work, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying print, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying printed illustration, to which reference is made.

The design is worked in squares; and consists of a border and a body. The body represents children dancing around a tree, holding hands. They are encompassed in a square border, representing garlands resting on an inner frame. The two upper corners are ornamented.

The design may be executed on a larger

scale within an increased number of squares. I reserve the right to reverse the position of the figures in the body, and to increase or diminish the number of garlands in the border; also, to make all the corners either like the upper two or the lower two; furthermore, to paint the figures in the body and the ornaments in the border in different colors for embroidery work.

I claim—

The design for embroidery pattern, consisting of a representation of children dancing around a tree, surrounded by a border of garlands, as above described, and illustrated by accompanying print.
